

## Alive and online

**The launch of the Opera Europa Digital Platform in no way compromises our fervent belief that opera is best experienced live in the theatre and in the company of others who are there for the same purpose.**

Madrid's opera houses continue to demonstrate the potency of live opera, despite the necessity to adapt to prevailing economic circumstances. Likewise, member companies across Europe are showing ingenuity in devising seasons which productively stretch resources in order to deliver more to audiences.

That purpose also inspires the online initiative which will be publicly launched in Madrid. At the heart of the Opera Platform will be performances streamed live from theatres; but alongside them will be shorter-form content which will provide context and enlightenment. The platform will be a fully integrated learning tool for those which wish to find out more about the world of opera.

On the final evening of the conference, delegates may choose to experience *La traviata* in the auditorium of Teatro Real, outside in the Plaza de Oriente, or via their computers or hand-held devices. In whichever form, it will be happening in real time... and very much ALIVE.

## Getting there

### Via Madrid-Barajas airport

#### By Metro:

From Madrid-Barajas airport, it is possible to take the metro. Line 8 to Nuevos Ministerios, then line 10 and stop at Alonso Martinez. Finally, line 5 to Opera. The journey time is approx. 45 minutes.

#### By Taxi:

The journey time is approximately 25 minutes and it costs 30€ from the airport to the centre of Madrid.

### Getting to the Reina Sofia Museum from the Teatro Real

From Opera metro station, line 2 to Puerta del Sol. Then, line 1 to Atocha. The museum is a 3 minute walk away. The journey time is approx. 20 minutes.

### Getting to the Teatro de la Zarzuela from the Teatro Real

From Opera metro station, line 2 to Sevilla. The journey time is approx. 12 minutes. You can also walk there in 15 minutes.
